It's been an interesting journey from Pulse to wholenote One reader, very early on, said "...you will probably get many, many letters from readers telling you how wonderful PULSE is." True enough! And we did.

"... Your excellent magazine" (Brian Wilson, North York); "What a good idea! (Pulse, that is.)" (Patty Llossa, New York); "I appreciate it & enjoy it very much." (Elena, Etobicoke); "...most useful, entertaining ... constantly growing and improving magazine." (Fred Kurban, North York); "a tremendous asset in assessing what is playing..." (Steve Living, Borough of York); " the source for concert information." (Douglas Schalin, Toronto); "entertaining and informative " (Mohsen Boctor and Nadia Lebar Boctor, Etobicoke)

Many of the early letters recommended staying with some variation of "pulse". Inclined that way ourselves at first, we considered "Puls@TO, "TO.Pulse", and

"ImPulse" and "SimPulse" (Chris Dawes) and "Re-Pulse" (Ruth Budd) and "Plus" and "Pulsate" (a real crowd favourite).

But then the tide started to turn. None of the x-Pulse names was as simply musical as the original. What about future readers who'd never heard of Pulse?

We decided the new name would have to stand on its own.

That very day it arrived:..."My suggestion is: The Whole Note. You could do whimsical things with the graphics. (Joy Gordon, Toronto)

We started rolling it round our mouths (along with "Keynotes" and "Acora" and "Courante".) Slept on it.

Started in 1959 as the Quebec




